

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE



NOVEMBER 2: The Church traditionally observes All Saints Day on the Sunday closest to November 1, as the day we remember those who have gone to their eternal home. On All Saints' Day, we offer thanks to God for the faith of the saints and praise Him for His faithfulness to His saints. God has promised He will be faithful to us as He has been faithful to the saints before us. All Saint's Day is a Festive Day and the liturgical color is White, the color of Joy and victory. During the service a candle will be lighted by the families of members of the congregation who died during the past year.

November 16 is Lutheran Women's Missionary League Sunday (LWML)

when the women of the church are honored for the ministry they offer. All women of Good Shepherd are members of LWML and are invited to attend our meetings on the 3rd Sunday of each month except during the summer and December. Our annual Christmas Dinner will be December 9. (See related article elsewhere.)





• On November 23, we will celebrate Christ the King Sunday. This is the last Sunday of the church year and the last Sunday after Pentecost. It celebrates the sovereignty or kingship of Christ. Christ the King Sunday is a Festival Sunday and the liturgical color is White for Joy and victory.

Thanksgiving Day is November 27 this year. This is a civil holiday set aside to give thanks for our bounty. Join us on **November 26 at 7:00 pm** at Good Shepherd as we join with members of the Lutheran Church of Our Saviour to give thanks to God for his bounty.


FALL CHURCH CLEAN-UP

Black and White Cookies



your clocks back before you go to bed Saturday

or you will be early for service Sunday.

1 cup packed brown sugar

- 1 cup butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups Gold Medal flour (AP)
- 1/3 cup unsweetened baking cocoa
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 bag(12 oz.) white chocolate chunks (2 cups)
- 1 jar (3.25 oz.) macadamia nuts, coarsely chopped

Heat oven to 325degrees F. In large bowl, beat brown sugar, butter, vanilla, and eggs with electric mixer on medium speed, or mix with spoon until creamy. Stir in flour, cocoa, baking soda, and salt. Stir in white chocolate chunks and nuts. Drop dough by 1/4 cupfuls about 2" apart onto ungreased large cookie sheet (do not use dark cookie sheet)

Bake 13 to 16 minutes or until cookies are set and appear dry (do not over bake). Cool 1 minute, remove from cookie sheet to wire rack.

Variation: Replace the white chunks with semisweet chocolate chips for a chocolate lover's cookie.

I substituted Smart Balance butter for the real stuff. Cuts a few fat grams Egg substitute for 1 egg and 1 regular egg

If wrapped by twos in saran wrap, the cookies travel well.




