REFORMATION DAY– The anniversary of Luther's posting the Ninety-five Theses concerning the sale of indulgences. From the 16th Century various dates were suggested for an annual commemoration of the reform of the church. In 1667, Elector John George II of Saxony reestablished the Reformation festival and appointed it for October 31. The celebration of the day spread among Lutherans, but the observance is not widely kept by Protestant Christians, or world Lutherans. Liturgical color is Red, repre-

senting the Holy Spirit and the Martyrs of the Christian Church.

October 2007 Quill Pastor's Note:

Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd: a 1. Spiritually growing, 2. Liturgically celebrating, 3. Mission motivated, 4. Serving, and 5. Forgiving community.

Recognize that statement? I hope that you do. It I supposed to reflect our congregational vision. As a congregational "vision statement" it describes WHO we are as , WHAT we value and what we-by God's grace and help- intend to DO as "*the called, gathered and enlightened*" people of God who serve Christ together in His Body.

Think about this "vision." Is it SHARED? That is to ask, is this something you agree with? Does the statement reflect what you understand and know to be true about Christ's Church as taught in the Holy Scriptures and our *Lutheran Confessions?* Does this "vision" reflect what you believe about Christ's church and our life together as His people in the congregation? Does it clearly state what our objectives and priorities are as a living community of those "redeemed in Christ?"

For the next five months, I will be using the "*Pastor's Note*" in the Quill to review our congregational "vision" with you. I will also challenge you to think about 1) what this congregational vision means, 2) how we measure up to it.

In the meantime, I want each of you, as members of our congregation to be thinking and praying about our congregation locally, as well as our participation in our Circuit (# 18), our District (the Southeastern), our Synod (the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod), along with the "church catholic." Any statement or "vision" about our congregation's mission ands ministry must begin, NOT with ourselves, but with what God in Christ has said and done for His church. I find that many people have all sorts of ideas about what should be done and how it should be done in the church, but if we do not begin with what Christ says, then we will "miss the mark" (sin) finding ourselves concerned and preoccupied with things that have little to do with our Lord Jesus Christ and His Word and work for the church. If you think about it, this "distraction" is rampant in many churches throughout our nation: congregations are increasingly polarized around national politics, human sexuality, ways to worship, money, organizational structures (Synod and District). While I believe that such things are important issues that influence our life together, I also know that these same issues can take on a "life of their own" and begin to consume and fragment the energy and resources of Christ's holy Church. This ought NOT to be.

So...as used to be said on network television shows many years ago: *"stay tuned"* for continued reflection on our life together as *The Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd*, and thoughtfully pray with me as we evaluate and examine what it means to be the *"Body of Christ"* together as a congregation located in Greenville, South Carolina and how Christ is present **through US** in His world to work His purpose.


reverence, humility, and care.





THE LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD VOTERS MEETING September 16, 2007

Bob Mead, President, welcomed the congregation, opened the meeting with prayer and called the meeting to order at 12:20 pm.

Thirty-seven voters were present. A list is on file.

Minutes from May 6, 2007 were reviewed with a correction made by Walter Meyer to the Financial Secretary report. The sentence was corrected to read "The shortage increased to \$442.04 per week". The minutes approved as.

Building Committee: Bill Tribbett elaborated on pending projects such as the installation of an elevator, a Land Use Study to plan for future use of the property, and the speaker shelving. A detailed report is on file.

Financial Secretary: Jenine Bristol presented a report for January 1 through September 9 of this year. The shortage decreased to \$344.86 per week. A full report is on file.

Treasurer: Gretchen Taylor reported that all bills are current. However, we are in the negative due to extra expenditures. A full report is on file.

Pastor: Pastor Saxe informed all voters that he will arrange with the Elders to invite the delegates for Circuit # 19 to report on the proceedings of this year's Synodical Convention, July 2007. Furthermore, Pastor Saxe is looking for a congregational contact to promote the "Ablaze" program.

In addition, Pastor Saxe reported that 7 members received instruction as Altar Servers. He met with Sunday School Superintendent Jacob Nagy and developed a schedule for the 2007-2008 academic year. Pastor Saxe thanked Jenine Bristol and Jim Derrick who devoted much time and energy to making the new hymnal a reality for the congregation. He reminded all voters that a representative for the Lutheran Hour is needed to check and reorder booklets.

Pastor Saxe reported that he performed two official acts: two marriages and one baptism. Two new members transferred in and 4 members were released. Pastor Saxe continues to conduct Adult/ Private/ Confirmation Instruction classes. A detailed report is on file.

Youth: Gary Meyer informed the voters that the Youth Retreat to LutherRock in Arden, NC in August was a success. All who attended enjoyed a wonderful weekend.

LWML: Sally Hyman reported that the LWML Annual Yard Sale made a profit of \$1,268.50. Thrivent will add \$1,100. The proceeds will be used to furnish the parlor. Sally Hyman informed the voters that the LWML Women's Christmas Party will be held at the church on Tuesday, December 4. All men are invited to Steve Graef's home at 6PM. LWML Sunday will be October 21, 2007. A report is on file.

Landscaping: Deb Beckwith reported that there are four trees that need to be taken down.

Elders: Paul Duffau made a motion:

To peaceful release Linda Sapp and Jack, Dee, Russell and Christopher Marks. All present voted and approved.

New Business

Pastor Saxe reminded the voters that our lectern was loaned to us by Our Savior and should be returned. The plan, when the church was rebuilt, was to move the current pulpit to the lectern side and obtain a new pulpit. Mr. Keith Jones, member of Trinity Lutheran, offered to construct a pulpit similar in style to, but larger than our existing pulpit for the cost of the materials (\$300.00).

Altar Guild: Joan Winkelman made a motion:

To offer the job to Mr. Jones with the understanding if the pulpit is not completed by December 2007, we will seek outside bids.

All present voted and approved.

Board of Finance: Gretchen Taylor made the following motions:

To recommend to the Voters to remove the Landscaping Money from the financial plan since landscaping money is restricted money and not part of the general operating fund. When that \$1,200 planned item is removed – also reduce miscellaneous expense by the same amount to maintain a balanced financial plan.

All voted and approved.

To recommend to the Voters to move refreshment monies into a Council Discretionary Fund rather than the Landscaping Fund as they currently do. This money can be requested by any member of the congregation. To make this request the member should get a Council Member to "sponsor" their request and present to the Council. This presentation need not be at a meeting, but can be informal through other means such as telephone calls and email. If the request is approved by the majority of the Council, the funds will be disbursed as requested.

All voted and approved.

To recommend to the Voters to move all refreshment fund received during the 2007 year to the Council Discretionary Fund. All other funds previously received will remain in land-scaping toward landscaping expenses.

All voted. One opposed, thirty-six approved.

To recommend that Bill Tribbett and Carl Martin remain on the Board of Finance for the new year.

Steve Graef 2nd the motion. All present approved.

Pastor: Pastor Saxe asked all members to help cover the cost of materials (\$100.00) to teach a course to residents of Perry Correction Center. Anke Meyer will provide envelopes to all members who agreed to sponsor one person. The one time contribution per person is \$7.50 and will be designated for Crossways.

Youth: Gary Meyer informed all voters that the LCGS Youth is planning a Free Sunday Sundae Social October 21, 2007 from 4PM – 6PM. He called on each member to help with the distribution of flyers.

Refreshment Coordinator: The Refreshments chart was circulated and additional volunteers for this social activity were enlisted.

Walter Meyer made a motion:

To allow the architects of our church to videotape a worship service. Bill Tribbett 2nd the motion. All present approved.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn at 2:15 pm.



- 1. In 1501-age 17 entered University of Erfurt where he received his master's degree in 1505.
- 2. Entered law school, dropped out and entered the Augustinian monastery in Erfurt in 1505.
- 3. Ordained in 1507 and began teaching at the University of Wittenberg in 1508
- 4. Received a Bachelor's degree in Biblical studies in 1508 and another Bachelor's degree in 1509. Awarded Doctor of Theology in 1512.
- 5. Joined the faculty of the University of Wittenberg 1512 where he spent the rest of his career.
- 6. German monk, theologian and church reformer. Also considered to be the founder of Protestantism.
- 7. His theology challenged the authority of the papacy by emphasizing the Bible as the sole source of religious authority and all baptized Christians as a general priesthood
- 8. 1517 wrote the 95 Theses and posted them on the door of the Castle Church
- 9. Excommunicated by Leo X in 1521.
- 10. Salvation was attainable only by faith in Jesus.
- 11. Translated the Bible into common language making it accessible to ordinary people. The translation furthered the development of a standard version of the German Language.
- 12. Wrote hymns which inspired the development of congregational singing.
- 13. His marriage was a model for the practice of clerical marriage within Protestantism.
